# JANUARY

# Ora por Guatemala!

(Pray for Guatemala!)

*“For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.” Eph. 6:12 (NIV)*

**Guatemala**, officially known as the Republic of Guatemala, is a Central American country famous for its vibrant mix of Mayan and Spanish cultures. Guatemala City is the capital city, as well as the largest city in Guatemala with a population of 3.3 million. For its size, Guatemala boasts impressive diversity of geography: mountains with lush valleys between, small patches of desert and sand dunes, and coastal lowlands.

**Kids Alive** has been serving vulnerable children here since 1992. Our Source of Hope School in the poverty-stricken town of Zapote is offering holistic care, education, and the good news of God’s love to over 200 children; our Oasis programs in San Lucas and Escuintla care for girls who have been sexually abused and traumatized and need emotional, medical, legal, and educational help to rebuild their lives.

## Things to know about Guatemala

- Spanish is spoken by 93% of the population
- Guatemala has the lowest literacy rate in Central America
- 49% of the population identify as Roman Catholic
- Over 5,000 girls between the ages of 10 and 14 give birth each year as a result of rape
- Guatemala has the sixth-highest rate of chronic malnutrition in the world at 47%
- Many traditional foods are based on Mayan cuisine and feature maize, beans, and chilis

## January Factoid

January is, on average, the coldest month of the year within most of the Northern Hemisphere and the warmest month of the year within most of the Southern Hemisphere.

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Guatemala this month?

- **Week one:** Our new Families Together Escuintla Care Center, providing legal, emotional, and spiritual resources for sexually abused girls who are broken and need healing
- **Week two:** Children at Source of Hope School, in the region where a powerful volcano erupted last year and left the town largely inaccessible and devastated, that they will know Jesus’ love
- **Week three:** Our efforts to place at-risk children who are ready into homes with loving, trained, and accountable Christian parents, that they will come to know the power of true family
- **Week four:** Staff ministering to traumatized children and completing their Trauma-Competent Caregiver training, pouring their lives out daily to give these kids hope and a fresh start

# FEBRUARY

## Prier pour Haiti!

(Pray for Haiti!)



*“Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress...” James 1:27a (NIV)*

**Haiti** is a sovereign state that shares the island of Hispaniola with Dominican Republic, and boasts the second-longest coastline in the Greater Antilles. Haitian culture combines African and European influences to form a unique atmosphere that is displayed in Haitian language, music, art, and religion. The capital city, Port-au-Prince, is home to 2.6 million people and most are of African descent.

**Kids Alive** has been rescuing hopeless children in Haiti since 2002 and opened our first children’s home in 2004. Kids Alive is one of only two homes out of 57 in the country meeting best practices. In addition to the home, we operate a school for residential children as well as those in the surrounding area, and more than 100 children attend the school. We also provide nutritious lunches and after-school tutoring to help students stay on track.

### Things to know about Haiti

- Haitian Creole, the language spoken by most Haitians, is a mixture of French, Spanish, and African influences
- Average annual per capita income in Haiti is \$250
- 55% of the population identify as Roman Catholic
- An estimated 230,000 people died in the 2010 earthquake
- Almost 80% of Haitians live in poverty

### February Factoid

February is named for the Latin word “februum”, which means “purification”. It is the only month that can pass without a full moon.



- **Week four:** Strength and wisdom for our staff as they care for our residential kids and students



# MARCH

# Ombi la Kenya!

(Pray for Kenya!)

*“But you, God, see the trouble of the afflicted;  
you consider their grief and take it in hand...  
You are the helper of the fatherless.” Ps. 10:14 (NIV)*

**Kenya**, officially the Republic of Kenya, is a country in eastern Africa and is situated over the equator. The terrain is large and diverse; the area extends from Lake Victoria to Lake Turkana, and farther southeast to the Indian Ocean. The estimated population is 48 million people, with 73% under 30 years old due to rapid population growth. From the snow-capped peaks of Mount Kenya to the humid, tropical climate along the coast, Kenya is home to an impressive array of natural resources.

**Kids Alive** currently provides an education, nutritious meals, medical care, and the love of Christ to 151 children in four residential homes and 350 children in our school. The Karundas Children’s Home provides loving care to children between the ages of 4 and 18, many of whom have been orphaned or abandoned due to the HIV/AIDS epidemic. 78% of these children are HIV-positive.

## Things to know about Kenya

- The two official languages of Kenya are English and Swahili
- The national literacy rate is 78%, but rural areas have rates as low as 8%
- 48% of the population identify as Protestant and 23% as Roman Catholic
- More than 3 million Kenyans are HIV-positive
- The risk of death for pregnant women is 1 in 38
- Kikuyu is the largest ethnic group in Kenya and accounts for one-fifth of the population

## March Factoid

March is the first month of spring in the Northern Hemisphere, and the first month of autumn in the Southern Hemisphere. It is named for Mars, the Roman god of war.

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Kenya this month?

- **Week one:** Staff and their families who are experiencing challenging circumstances and spiritual warfare
- **Week two:** That KAK will find favour with the government as we seek to meet ever-changing requirements in education, facilities, etc. and that we will act with wisdom
- **Week three:** Our children’s emotional and spiritual healing and direction, that it will be continual and not just seasonal
- **Week four:** God’s provision for the many funding challenges as we seek to minister to more children

APRIL

صلوا عن أجل لبنان

(Pray for Lebanon!)

*“When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner... must be treated as your native born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt.” Lev. 19:33-34 (NIV)*

**Lebanon** is one of the world’s smallest countries, with an area of only 10,452 square km (4,035 square miles), but within its borders are several very diverse geographical regions. The country’s physical geography is complex, and land forms, climate, soils, and vegetation differ markedly within short distances. The capital city is Beirut and it serves as the main seaport. Arabs make up 95% of Lebanon’s population and Armenians account for 4%.

**Kids Alive** has been ministering to orphans and other at-risk children in Lebanon for 70 years! At our Dar El Awlad Children’s Home, we are providing care for 20 vulnerable boys who have been orphaned or are homeless for other reasons. Care includes shelter, food, clothing, medical attention, education, and house parents who provide love and emotional support. We also operate schools and refugee programs that serve hundreds of at-risk children.

## Things to know about Lebanon

- Arabic is the official language of Lebanon
- 54% of Lebanese identify as Muslim
- Only 38% of females complete secondary education
- Less than 30% of school-aged refugee children receive any formal education
- Lebanese cuisine features an abundance of garlic, olive oil, chickpeas, and fresh seafood

## April Factoid

April was originally the second month of the year, and contained 29 days until Julius Caesar reformed the calendar and gave it an extra day.

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Lebanon this month?

- **Week one:** That our new residential children will adjust well, participate enthusiastically, and feel welcomed in their new home
- **Week two:** That our kids at Dar El Awlad will experience the joy of forgiveness and reconciliation and will see the staff model the freedom that comes with the choice to forgive
- **Week three:** Direction, funding, and human resources needed in the New Horizons program as we work to build bridges between the Gypsy and the Syrian refugee communities
- **Week four:** Our new group of Oasis (refugee) kids, as they work hard to gain the skills to progress to the next academic level at Dar El Awlad, and that they will meet the living Christ there

# MAY

## Ora por Peru!

(Pray for Peru!)



*“Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the One who sent me.” Mark 9:37 (NIV)*

**Peru** is located on the west side of South America and is an immensely biodiverse country, with habitats ranging from arid to tropical. The country contains parts of the Andes mountain range and the Amazon basin rainforest. 31.5 million people reside in Peru, 76% of whom live in urban areas; it is the fourth most populous country in South America. There are an estimated 15 uncontacted Amerindian tribes in Peru.

**Kids Alive** is hard at work near the capital city of Lima in our Juniper Tree Children’s Home. This residential facility provides family-style homes for over 20 at-risk children and offers holistic care, education, and the knowledge of eternal hope in Christ as Saviour. In Manchay, our care center and school are providing education, meals, Bible lessons, basic health care, and early childhood skills for younger at-risk children.

### Things to know about Peru

- Spanish is spoken by 84% of the population
- Amerindians comprise the largest ethnic group in Peru (45%)
- Over 80% of the population identify as Roman Catholic
- Almost 70% of Peruvian women report some form of physical abuse
- Many traditional foods are based on Incan and European tradition and feature potatoes, quinoa, and peppers

### May Factoid

Eta Aquariids meteor shower appears in May, with peak activity on or around May 6. It is best viewed in the pre-dawn hours, away from the glow of city lights.

### Important Date of Awareness in May

May 15 – International Day of Families

### How can I pray for Kids Alive Peru this month?

- **Week one:** That God will bless the development of our therapeutic programs, and that He will bless the relationships between kids and counselors, breaking down walls and building trust
- **Week two:** Staff who are undergoing Trauma-Competent Caregiver Training, that they will assimilate all they are learning and apply it with wisdom in the lives of our kids
- **Week three:** Healing, both emotional and spiritual, for our girls at House of Glory, and for wisdom for the staff as they meet the needs of these moms and their babies
- **Week four:** For the emotional, spiritual, and relational needs of our staff and missionary families, that they will grow in their walk with God and know Him intimately

**Taiwan**, officially the Republic of China, is an island in East Asia characterized by its varied landscape: rugged mountain ranges and the flat and gently rolling plains that are home to most of Taiwan’s residents. Local culture blends elements of Chinese and Japanese history with increasingly Western ideas. Taipei is the capital city and has a population of seven million, which includes the surrounding metropolitan areas.

**Kids Alive** has been working in Taiwan since 1971, primarily ministering to children from dysfunctional families or those who have been disabled by injury or disease. The campuses of the Nantou and Onesiphorus Children’s Homes include family-style homes where children are provided with loving house parents, holistic care, quality education, nutritious meals, and the good news of Christ’s love.

## Things to know about Taiwan

- The island’s population is an estimated 23 million
- Taiwan is the world’s 22nd largest economy
- Mandarin is the official language and is spoken by 83% of residents
- Buddhism and Taoism account for the majority of religious beliefs, each about 34%
- It takes about 15 hours to drive around the entire island of Taiwan
- The Portuguese “discovered” Taiwan in 1590 and named it “Ilha Formosa” or “Beautiful Island”
- Taiwan has an abundant supply of tropical fruits such as papaya, starfruit, and melons

## June Factoid

June contains the day with the most daylight hours in the Northern Hemisphere, and the day with the fewest hours in the Southern Hemisphere.

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Taiwan this month?

- **Week one:** Successful completion of our land purchase in Puli, allowing us to expand the help we offer to vulnerable children
- **Week two:** Provision of two social workers for Onesiphorus Home in Taitung and two house parents at Nantou Home in Puli
- **Week three:** Continued willingness of our children to share their blessings by sponsoring Kids Alive children and projects in four other countries
- **Week four:** God’s direction regarding future leadership of the Taiwan ministry

# JULY

# Ora por República Dominicana!

(Pray for Dominican Republic!)

*“In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: ‘It is more blessed to give than to receive.’” Acts 20:35 (NIV)*

**Dominican Republic** is a sovereign nation that shares the island of Hispaniola with Haiti in the Greater Antilles. The capital city of Santo Domingo and surrounding metropolitan areas are situated on the southern coast and are home to almost 3 million of Dominican Republic’s 10 million residents. Lush valleys, rugged mountain ranges, and many offshore islands and cays give this island country a diverse topography.

**Kids Alive** currently serves more than 2,000 children in Dominican Republic; our Ark homes in Jarabacoa, Constanza, and Monte Plata house and care for children who are orphaned or abandoned and need a safe place to live, and our schools and care centers provide education, support, and Bible studies for local at-risk children in impoverished communities.

## Things to know about Dominican Republic

- Creole is the largest minority language due to increased Haitian immigrant population
- 57% of the population identify as Roman Catholic, and 23% as Protestant
- The dropout rate of secondary schools is an alarming 50%, and in some areas, 90%
- Two out of 10 girls between the ages of 15 and 19 are or have been pregnant
- Almost 10% of all cocaine in the United States is smuggled through Dominican Republic
- Traditional Dominican treats include flan, dulce de leche, and caña (sugarcane)

## July Factoid

July was originally called “Quintilis” until it was renamed by the Roman Senate in honor of Julius Caesar, being the month of his birth.

## Important Date of Awareness in July

July 30 – World Day against Trafficking in Persons

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Dominican Republic this month?

- **Week one:** Effective selection process for new students in places where we only have space for one out of five applicants, all of whom live in extreme poverty
- **Week two:** For God to use our Service Teams, interns, and other visitors to create awareness of and love for at-risk kids in DR
- **Week three:** For the spiritual growth and stability of our 275 staff (90% of them Dominican nationals) pouring their lives out in service of over 2,000 children
- **Week four:** Effective discipleship of our university-age students, and our July “Independence Camp” which prepares them for the transition from our care to independent living

# AUGUST

# صلى من أجل جنوب السودان

(Pray for South Sudan!)

*“Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy.”* Prov. 31:8-9 (NIV)

**South Sudan**, officially known as the Republic of South Sudan, gained its independence from Sudan in July of 2011. 12 million people reside here and the capital and largest city of Juba has a population of nearly half a million. This newly-formed nation is covered mostly in tropical forest, swamps, and grassland and hosts the second-largest wildlife migration in the world.

**Kids Alive** has been operating the Good Shepherd Home in Wau since 2007, where boys who had previously lived on the streets or came from abusive homes can live in safety. Here they can have their physical, emotional, education, and social needs met in a loving atmosphere that is permeated with the Gospel and hope for a better future. The ministry also provides teachers for boys in a local juvenile prison, infant formula for babies in the nearby UN camp, and helps with school fees for 162 community children.

## Things to know about South Sudan

- Over 60 indigenous languages are spoken in South Sudan
- More than 70% of the adult population is illiterate
- South Sudan maintains the highest female illiteracy rate in the world
- 51% of the population lives on less than \$1/day
- 12,000 people die of HIV/AIDS every year, many of those leaving behind orphans
- Almost 50% of South Sudan residents have no access to safe drinking water

## August Factoid

August was originally named “Sextilis” and had only 29 days. When Julius Caesar created the Julian calendar, he added two days and it was later renamed in honor of Augustus.

## How can I pray for Kids Alive South Sudan this month?

- **Week one:** Lasting peace and rest for this war-torn nation
- **Week two:** Healing from the trauma caused by war and loss of families
- **Week three:** For the provision of more capacity-building funds to equip and upskill the staff so they can provide quality, holistic care for the boys
- **Week four:** That God will touch the heart of 12-year-old Faheem\* and keep him from running away to the streets where he would likely be abused

# SEPTEMBER

မြန်မာပြည်အတွက် ဆုတောင်းပေးပါ

(Pray for Myanmar!)

*“The spirit of the sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives...”* Is. 61:1 (NIV)

**Myanmar**, also known as Burma, is a southeast Asian country with 1,200 miles of uninterrupted coastline, natural resources like jade, oil, and teak, and over 800 species of birds. Myanmar has a population of 51.4 million people, and 5 million of those live in the former capital city of Yangon. The current capital is Naypyidaw, which is the transportation hub of the country and has a strong government and military presence.

**Kids Alive** is currently serving 72 children in an after-school program in Dawei. These at-risk children, who come from the poorest sectors and often live in makeshift homes, are provided with meals, snacks, vitamins, educational support, books, and basic medical care. Our staff strive to foster a warm and caring environment where children can feel safe and have their needs met.

## Things to know about Myanmar

- There are 135 officially recognized ethnic groups in Myanmar
- Many languages are spoken in Myanmar, with Sino-Tibetan languages most widely spoken
- More than 90% of the population identify as Buddhist
- An estimated 20,000 people die from HIV/AIDS every year
- Maternal mortality rate is 178 per 100,000 births
- The national dish of Myanmar is Mohinga, a noodle and fish soup served for breakfast

## September Factoid

September was called “harvest month” in Charlemagne’s calendar, and is known in Switzerland as “Herbstmonat”.

## Important Date of Awareness in September

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Myanmar this month?

- **Week one:** That our kids at Dawei Care Center may put their faith in Christ; they are all from strong Buddhist backgrounds
- **Week two:** Divine wisdom and power for the staff as they care for vulnerable children daily
- **Week three:** Resources to purchase a plot of land and build a building; the care center is currently in a rented house
- **Week four:** Provision of at least two more staff members to teach and train our kids intensively

# OCTOBER

## Amucipailile cisi ca Zambia!

(Pray for Zambia!)

*“Sing to God, sing in praise of His name, extol Him who rides on the clouds; rejoice before Him – His name is the Lord. A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows is God in His holy dwelling.” Ps 68:4-5 (NIV)*

**Zambia**, officially the Republic of Zambia, is a land-locked country in south-central Africa and has a population of 16.5 million. Lusaka is the capital city and largest city, and is home to over four million people. The climate is tropical and geography consists of high plateaus and mountains dissected by river valleys. With 14 ecosystems and more than 7,000 different animal species, Zambia boasts impressive biodiversity.

**Kids Alive** is ministering to over 700 at-risk children in Lusaka, and in Mongu in western Zambia. Two residential villages, one school, and our care center program strive to provide holistic care, recognizing the distinct needs of boys and girls. Our homes provide a safe place to sleep, nutritious meals, health care, and daily Gospel teaching. Our schools provide quality education, Bible studies, and at least one meal a day to over 600 children. For many children this is the only meal they'll eat each day.

## Things to know about Zambia

- English is the official language of Zambia
- Literacy rate for Zambian women is 56%
- Zambia is a Christian nation by constitutional declaration
- 115 new pediatric HIV/AIDS cases are diagnosed every day
- Less than half of all Zambians have access to adequate sanitation
- Zambia is home to Victoria Falls, one of the seven natural wonders of the world

## October Factoid

Although it is the tenth month in the Gregorian calendar, October (from the Latin “octo”, meaning “eight”) retained its name from the Roman calendar where it was the eighth month.

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Zambia this month?

- **Week one:** Relations with the host government, that we will add value to the community and be protected from negative arbitrary decisions of government officials
- **Week two:** Growth of the ministry, wisdom in program choices, and creativity to design sustainable ministry approaches
- **Week three:** For God to open the hearts of donors who will be led to give so that more children can be helped
- **Week four:** For our team of 43 national staff, that God will give wisdom, preserve unity, and protect morale during challenging times

# NOVEMBER

# Rugați-vă pentru România!

(Pray for Romania!)

*“This is what the Lord Almighty said: ‘Administer true justice; show mercy and compassion to one another. Do not oppress the widow or fatherless, the foreigner or the poor...’”* Zech. 7:9-10a (NIV)

**Romania** is a sovereign nation in Eastern Europe that borders the Black Sea to the southeast and is the seventh most populous member country of the European Union, boasting almost 20 million residents. Europe’s famous River Danube empties into Romania’s Danube Delta, and the Carpathian Mountains cross the country from north to southwest. Romania is home to one of the largest areas of undisturbed forest in Europe.

**Kids Alive** currently operates two programs in the village of Dobrun for almost 50 at-risk children. At House of Hope, we have housed and cared for 10 girls in a loving home environment and have seen them learn, grow, and thrive. Denisa Care Center provides tutoring, school supplies, healthy social activities, and nutritious snacks to local at-risk children.

## Things to know about Romania

- The official language is Romanian, spoken by 90% of the population
- Approximately 42% of 15-year-olds in Romania are functionally illiterate
- 81% of Romanians identify as Orthodox Christians
- 20% of children in Romania are forced into labour to support their families
- Bran Castle, also known as Dracula’s Castle, is located in Brasov County, Romania

## November Factoid

November was the ninth month of the ancient Roman calendar and has retained its name from the Latin novem, meaning “nine.”

November 11 – National Tree Planting Day (Luxembourg)

## Important Date of Awareness in November

November 25 – International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Romania this month?

- **Week one:** Wisdom for our staff of 10 as we nurture our vulnerable kids
- **Week two:** Safety and protection for our kids who must travel by train from home to university
- **Week three:** Success in this new school year, especially for our 8th graders who are sitting for exams and for job prospects for our new graduates
- **Week four:** A new van for the Denisa Care Center – public transport is available but shortens the day considerably and reduces the amount of time we can pour love and God’s Word into the children’s lives

DECEMBER

صلى من أجل السودان  
(Pray for Sudan!)

*“Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervour, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with the Lord’s people who are in need. Practice hospitality.” Rom. 12:11-13 (NIV)*

**Sudan**, officially known as the Republic of Sudan and sometimes referred to as North Sudan, is a country in northeast Africa. It is the third largest country in Africa with a population of roughly 37 million inhabitants. The capital city, Khartoum, is located at the confluence of the Blue Nile and White Nile where the Nile River is formed. Sudan also contains rich mineral resources such as copper, cobalt, gold, granite, and natural gases.

**Kids Alive** is currently caring for 22 young boys in the Boys’ Hope Center in Sudan. This war-torn country has left many children with no safety from crime and child labour, and our committed caregivers provide physical, emotional, social, and educational support all while showing the love of Christ to at-risk boys. Healthy meals and basic medical care give these boys hope for a brighter tomorrow.

## Things to know about Sudan

- Arabic and English are the official languages of Sudan, with Arabic most widely spoken
- Arabs make up about 70% of the Sudanese population
- Over 97% of residents are adherents to Islam
- More than 10% of children don’t live to see their 5th birthday
- The female literacy rate is 60.8%
- Safe drinking water is not available to 40% of the population

## December Factoid

In the Roman calendar, the winter days following December were not included as part of any month.

## How can I pray for Kids Alive Sudan this month?

- **Week one:** Successful resolution of a court case seeking to retrieve two of our vehicles that were confiscated by the local government
- **Week two:** Freedom to practice our Christian faith; currently we cannot increase the number of children we serve because we are Christian
- **Week three:** Spiritual growth, stamina, and consistency in the lives of our boys and our six staff members at Boys’ Hope Center
- **Week four:** God’s provision through the funding challenges we face in providing for the needs of our boys
